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## SUMMARY

Council of Ministers:

**Decree No. 8/2022:**

Approves the Standardization and Conformity Assessment Regulation and revokes Decrees No. 59/2009, of 8 October and No. 19/2010, of 30 June.

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## COUNCIL OF MINISTERS

### **Decree n. 8/2022 of 14 March**

Since there is a need to revise Decree No. 59/2009, of 8 October, which approves the Regulation for Standardization and Conformity Assessment, in order to bring it into line with the new normative and regulatory requirements for standardization and conformity assessment and under paragraph *f*) number 1 article 203 of the Constitution of the Republic, the Council of Ministers determines:

Article 1. The Regulation for Standardization and Conformity Assessment, annexed to this Decree and which forms an integral part thereof, is hereby approved.

Art. 2. It is incumbent upon the Minister who oversees the area of industry and commerce to approve the standards for the application of this Decree.

Art. 3. Decrees no. 59/2009, of 8 October and no. 19/2010, of 30 June are hereby revoked.

Art. 4. This Decree comes into force on the date of its publication.

## Standardization and Conformity Assessment Regulation

### CHAPTER I

#### General provisions

#### ARTICLE 1

##### (Definitions)

The meaning of the terms used in these Regulations is set out in the glossary, annexed to these Regulations and which forms an integral part of it.

#### ARTICLE 2

##### (Object)

This Regulation establishes the legal framework for standardization activities and conformity assessment.

#### ARTICLE 3

##### (Scope of application)

This Regulation applies to the process of drafting, approving, homologating and publishing Mozambican technical regulations and Technical Standards, as well as to conformity assessment activities.

#### ARTICLE 4

##### (Objectives)

This Regulation has the following objectives:

- a)* promote the use of Technical Mozambicans Standards;
- b)* promote and ensure conformity assessment activities;
- c)* simplify and allow interchangeability and compatibility of products, processes and services;
- d)* facilitate communication between the supplier and the consumer;
- e)* protect the consumer from unfair trade practices;
- f)* ensure fair competition;
- g)* promote equal treatment of national and imported products;
- h)* encourage quality improvement;
- i)* promote trade and international cooperation;
- j)* preserve national security imperatives;
- k)* protect human health, safety and the environment;
- l)* add value to Mozambican brands;
- m)* facilitate Mozambique's insertion in international trade;
- n)* eliminate technical barriers to trade;
- o)* ensure the circulation in the country of products that comply with technical standards and regulations; and

- p) establish conformity assessment programmes and ensure quality control of domestic and imported products marketed in the country.

## CHAPTER II

### Stakeholders and Skills

#### ARTICLE 5

##### (Stakeholders)

Intervenes in standardization and conformity assessment activities:

- a) Ministries;
- b) Public Institutes;
- c) Companies;
- d) Universities;
- e) Laboratories;
- f) Economic, professional and researcher associations;
- g) Consumer protection associations;
- h) Non-Governmental Organizations; and
- i) Individuals.

#### ARTICLE 6

##### (Skills)

1. It is, in particular, the responsibility of the Instituto Nacional de Normalização e Qualidade (National Institute for Standardization and Quality, INNOQ, IP):
  - a) coordinate and develop standardization activities in the country together with other stakeholders;
  - b) managing the national mark of compliance;
  - c) designate the conformity assessment bodies to use the national conformity assessment mark on the evaluated products;
  - d) recognize the technical competence of the conformity assessment bodies, while the accreditation entity hasn't been created;
  - e) implement Mozambican Technical Standards that support the technical regulations drawn up by entities with legal regulatory competence.
  - f) decide on the delegation of competences to other public and private entities, through a prior qualification process;
  - g) verify the conformity of domestic and imported products;
  - h) carry out technical inspection activities of equipment;
  - i) certify the compliance of management systems, products, processes, services and people with the Mozambican Technical Standards and, in the absence of these, with the International Technical Standards;
  - j) develop and manage Conformity Assessment Programmes; and
  - k) establish guidelines and criteria for Standardization and Conformity Assessment Activities.
2. The powers of other players are defined in their respective statutes.

## CHAPTER III

### Mozambican Technical Standards

#### ARTICLE 7

##### (Statute of Mozambican Technical Standards)

1. The Mozambican Technical Standards are voluntary in nature, the application of which depends on the need for their use.
2. Mozambican Technical Standards become mandatory when they support technical regulations or a general law, aiming to achieve a legitimate objective.

#### ARTICLE 8

##### (Drafting)

1. The Mozambican Technical Standards (NM) are drawn up based on international standards, except when such international standards or their main elements are an inadequate or ineffective means of achieving legitimate objectives.
2. The Mozambican Technical Standards (NM) are drawn up by the Standardization Technical Commissions (CTN), by the Standardization Technical Subcommittees (SCTN) and by the Standardization Working Groups (GTN), whose composition comes from the actors referred to in article 5 of these Regulations.
3. When there are no Mozambican Technical Standards for a given product, process or service, it is up to the regulatory authority to request INNOQ, IP to prepare them.
4. INNOQ, IP, should invite all stakeholders to participate in the Standardization Technical Commissions (CTN), in the Standardization Technical Subcommittees (SCTN) and in the Standardization Working Groups (GTN).

#### ARTICLE 9

##### (Approval, homologation, edition and publication)

1. Mozambican Technical Standards are approved by the Technical Commission for Sectorial Standardization (CTNS).
2. Mozambican Technical Standards are homologated by the head of INNOQ, IP, and the homologation list is published in the III Series of the *Official Gazette*.
3. The Mozambican Technical Standards come into force after their edition.
4. It is Only considered Mozambican Technical Standards texts prepared in accordance with the provisions of this Regulation and presented as such before regional and international standardization organizations.

#### ARTICLE 10

##### (Analysis and review)

1. The review of the Mozambican Technical Standards is carried out every five years, after analysis and decision by the respective technical commission.
2. The review of Mozambican Technical Standards is carried out before the period specified above, if technological progress or economic or social conditions so require, or at the request of the entity with regulatory competence in the matter.
3. The review of the Mozambican Technical Standards follows the same process as that of their drafting.
4. The review and repeal of Mozambican Technical Standards, referred to in technical regulations, are coordinated by INNOQ, IP, with the participation of all entities with regulatory competence in the matter, which should form part of the respective Standardization Technical Commissions.

## ARTICLE 11

**(Intellectual Property)**

1. The Mozambican Technical Standards and other normative publications prepared and published, in accordance with the process established in the present Regulation, are treated as collective intellectual works, benefiting from protection under the terms of the applicable legislation.

2. The copyright, corresponding to the normative publications referred to in the previous number, belongs to INNOQ, IP.

## CHAPTER IV

**Technical Regulations**

## ARTICLE 12

**(Drafting)**

1. Technical regulations are drawn up by the competent authorities in areas where the product, process or service may pose risks to the health and safety of consumers or the environment.

2. In the preparation, approval and application of technical regulations, the following must be observed:

- a) technical regulations must be based on Mozambican Technical Standards or in their absence on harmonized Regional Technical Standards or International Technical Standards;
- b) in the preparation of technical regulations, the method of reference to standards must be followed; and
- c) technical regulations must not constitute unnecessary technical barriers to trade.

3. All technical regulations drawn up in accordance with the provisions of the previous numbers must, before approval, be sent to INNOQ, IP, for the purpose of notifying the World Trade Organization (WTO).

4. The purpose of the notification is to make the technical regulation available to stakeholders for a period of 60 days for comments so that, once approved, it does not constitute an unnecessary technical barrier to trade.

## ARTICLE 13

**(Reference to technical standards)**

Reference to technical standards is made by designating only the number and title of one or more specific technical standards, so that subsequent reviews of this or these standards are applied without it being necessary to modify the Regulation.

## CHAPTER V

**Conformity assessment**

## SECTION I

## Activities and procedures

## ARTICLE 14

**(Activities)**

1. Activities within the framework of conformity assessment must take into account national needs, be non-discriminatory, be transparent and avoid unnecessary technical barriers to trade, based on technical standards and regulations.

2. Conformity assessment activities can be carried out by:
- a) first part: when it is made by the supplier;

b) second part: when it is made by the buyer or consumer; and

c) third party: when it is carried out by an organization that is independent from the supplier and the buyer or consumer, who has no interest in selling the product.

3. The conformity assessment procedure is mandatory for suppliers of products, processes and services when related to a technical regulation.

4. When the conformity assessment procedure is related to Mozambican Technical Standards, it is voluntary.

5. Conformity assessment procedures form part of mandatory control product conformity assessment programs.

6. Conformity Assessment Activities for national products are carried out by public entities with competences defined in specific legislation.

## ARTICLE 15

**(Conformity assessment procedures)**

1. In the conformity assessment procedures based on technical standards and regulations, the attribution of licenses, certificates and marks must be established according to the features of the product, process or service to be assessed.

2. It is the obligation of suppliers to subject their goods to the conformity assessment mechanisms provided for in the conformity assessment procedures.

3. In the conformity assessment procedures, the following mechanisms may be used:

- a) Supplier's declaration of conformity;
- b) Certification;
- c) Inspection;
- d) Labeling; and
- e) Testing.

4. Conformity assessment procedures are described in Portuguese.

5. Conformity assessment procedures, when mandatory, must be established by the entity with regulatory competence in partnership with INNOQ, IP, in order to be granted the right to use the national conformity mark.

6. Conformity assessment procedures, when voluntary, must be established by INNOQ, IP.

## SECTION II

## Conformity Assessment Programmes

## ARTICLE 16

**(Conformity Assessment Programs)**

1. All imported products whose conformity assessment is mandatory are subject to the conformity assessment programme, in accordance with the list of mandatory control products, attached to this regulation, which is subject to updating whenever public health, safety and environment reasons determine so.

2. Every product covered by the Conformity Assessment Programme must be evaluated and approved based on the Mozambican Technical Standards on quality, technical regulations or other technical specifications adopted by INNOQ, IP.

3. The technical specifications applicable to the Conformity Assessment Programmes for mandatory control products are published and made available by INNOQ, IP, and by interrelated entities.

4. The conformity of the product with the technical specifications recommended in this article is evidenced by displaying the conformity mark on its label or packaging, or even through a certificate of conformity issued by an entity selected by INNOQ, IP, which must be presented to the Customs Authorities at the act of entry into the country.

5. The list of mandatory control products is subject to periodic updates depending on the risk analysis that each product represents to public health, the environment and safety, and must be approved by Ministerial Diploma, by the Minister who oversees the area of Industry and Commerce and published in the I Series of the *Official Gazette*.

6. The products covered by this Regulation, when imported, may be subject to inspection upon entry into the country.

#### ARTICLE 17

##### (Conformity assessment procedures of imported products)

The procedures within the scope of conformity assessment programmes are described and approved by INNOQ, IP, and cover the following activities:

- a) physical inspection prior to shipment;
- b) sampling, testing and analysis in accredited laboratories;
- c) audits within the scope of assessing the degree of implementation of technical standards relating to product manufacturing processes; and
- d) document analysis or verification and conformity assessment with the requirements of applicable standards and/or regulations.

#### ARTICLE 18

##### (Conditions for authorization)

1. The conditions required for an entity to be authorized to represent INNOQ, IP, in the execution of Conformity Assessment Programmes are the following:

- a) professional competence and qualified personnel;
- b) equipment and infrastructure that meet the requirements for conformity assessment, including international accredited laboratories network;
- c) independence and impartiality in the conformity assessment procedure;
- d) interoperability capacity and establishment of a communication platform, to check conformity by INNOQ, IP, anywhere in the world, in real time; and
- e) confidentiality.

2. For the purposes of number 1 of this article, the selection of the entity is made through a public tender.

3. INNOQ, IP maintains the register and publishes the Conformity Assessment Entities authorized to represent it in the most widely circulated newspaper.

#### ARTICLE 19

##### (Supervision)

When it is demonstrated that the product does not comply with the essential requirements, the costs arising from the supervision of Conformity Assessment activities, within the scope of Conformity Assessment Programmes, are the responsibility of:

- a) importers; and
- b) domestic producers and packers.

#### SECTION III

##### Conformity Marks, Certificates of Conformity and Licenses

#### ARTICLE 20

##### (Conformity marks, certificates of conformity and licenses)

1. Conformity of products, processes or services with technical standards and regulations is evidenced by conformity marks and certificates.

2. It is incumbent upon the Minister who oversees the industry and commerce sector to approve the national conformity mark, which ensures compliance with the requirements established by technical standards and regulations, whose mechanisms and conditions are defined in the respective conformity assessment procedures.

3. The management of the national conformity mark is the responsibility of INNOQ, IP.

4. The national conformity mark is protected by current legislation.

5. Certificates of Conformity and licenses are issued within the scope of carrying out Conformity Assessment Activities in accordance with established procedures and applicable legislation.

#### CHAPTER VI

##### Inspection, Fees, Infractions and Sanctions

#### ARTICLE 21

##### (Inspection)

1. Without prejudice to other entities with supervisory functions, it is up to the entity that oversees the areas of economic activities to monitor compliance with the provisions of these Regulations.

2. The supervisory body referred to in the previous number may, in the exercise of its duties, request the collaboration of judicial, public security or administrative authorities.

#### ARTICLE 22

##### (Fees)

1. Fees are due for the Conformity Assessment Activity under the terms of this Regulation.

2. It is incumbent upon the Minister of Finance and the person responsible for the area of activity to approve, by joint Ministerial Diploma, the fees referred to in the previous number, as well as the destination to be given to the respective revenues.

#### ARTICLE 2

##### (Infractions)

Without prejudice to the offenses provided for in general law, the following constitute offenses to this Regulation:

- a) the partial or total reproduction of the Mozambican Technical Standard made by an entity other than INNOQ, IP;
- b) the improper use of the certificate, license or conformity mark for a purpose other than that for which it was intended;
- c) the adoption of conduct or omissions that deceive the consumer or constitute a practice that may mislead him;
- d) the impediment or obstruction of an agent in the exercise of his powers;



- e) substantial modification of a product, process or service that has been subject to a conformity assessment, without prior notice to the competent authority;
- f) the declaration or demonstration of the status of the certificate to carry out a specific job, activity or function, in cases where the corresponding certification has not been granted;
- g) the use of the expired certificate or license;
- h) the lack of products subjection to the conformity assessment processes foreseen in the technical regulation;
- i) the use of Conformity Assessment Programs that are not described in Portuguese;
- j) the placing by any company, other legal person or entrepreneur of a product into circulation that:
  - i. does not comply with approved technical standards or regulations regarding intrinsic characteristics;
  - ii. has not been assessed, its compliance in accordance with an approved procedure;
  - iii. is not marked in accordance with the established technical requirements, or not accompanied by the respective approval documents;
  - iv. appears with a conformity mark or any other mark similar to the approved conformity mark, without complying with approved technical standards or regulations in relation to the intrinsic characteristics; and
  - v. presents itself with a conformity assessment mark carried out, by an administrative authority or a legal person of conformity assessment non-authorized for that purpose.

#### ARTICLE 24

##### (Sanctions)

1. Without prejudice to the sanctions provided for in the legislation in force, and the corresponding civil or criminal responsibilities, the violation of the provisions of these Regulations is subject to administrative sanctions and punishable by a fine according to the nature of the infraction.
2. The accumulation of offenses is sanctioned with the sum of the corresponding fines.
3. The infractions foreseen in article 22, for the standardization and conformity assessment activity, have the following graduation:
  - a) fine corresponding to 50 minimum wages in case of violation of the provisions of subparagraphs a), b), c) and d);
  - b) fine corresponding to 75 minimum wages in the event of violation of the provisions of paragraph e);
  - c) fine corresponding to 100 minimum wages in case of violation of the provisions of paragraphs f) and g);
  - d) fine corresponding to 200 minimum wages in case of violation of the provisions of paragraph h);
  - e) fine corresponding to 50 minimum wages in the event of violation of the provisions of paragraph i);
  - f) fine of 250 minimum wages, seizure and destruction of the product in case of violation of the provisions of items i) and iv) of paragraph j);
  - g) fine of 200 minimum wages and payment of revaluation charges in case of violation of the provisions of items ii), iii) and v) of item j).

4. For the purposes of these Regulations, minimum wages are considered to be the minimum remuneration for the respective sector of activity.

5. Depending on the seriousness of the infringement, sanctions of suspension, license revocation and withdrawal of the Conformity Assessment Certificate may be applied cumulatively with a fine.

#### ARTICLE 25

##### (Seizure)

1. It is incumbent upon the entity that oversees the areas of economic activities to apprehend products found in situations provided for in subparagraphs of paragraph j) of article 22 of these Regulations.

2. Products seized on a permanent basis, by virtue of the penalty applied, which can no longer be appealed at the administrative level, when they should not be destroyed, are donated to social support programmes developed by the State or to education or social assistance institutions recognized as charity entities and their commercialization is prohibited.

#### ARTICLE 26

##### (Recidivism)

1. There is recidivism when the agent, to whom the sanctions related to the infractions mentioned in article 22 of these Regulations have been applied, commits another identical one.

2. Recidivism related to the infractions mentioned in article 22 of these Regulations is punishable by double the amount of the stipulated fines.

#### ARTICLE 27

##### (Payment of fines)

1. The deadline for voluntary payment of the fine is 15 days from the date of notification receipt.

2. The amount of the fine passed for the commission of the infractions foreseen in the present Regulation, must be paid in the domicile of the inspection entity.

3. In the absence of voluntary payment of the fine within the period provided for in paragraph 1 of this article, the respective certificate of relaxation must be extracted by the entity that supervises economic activities and sent to the Private Judgment for Tax Executions.

#### ARTICLE 28

##### (Destination of fines)

The proceeds from the fines are divided into 20% for the State Budget and 80% for the supervisory body.

## Annex I

### Glossary

For the purposes of the provisions of this Regulation, it is understood:

1. **Accreditation:** assessment carried out by a third party relative to a conformity assessment body, expressing formal demonstration of its competence to carry out specific conformity assessment tasks.

2. **Normative document analysis:** activity of checking a normative document to determine if it needs to be reconfirmed, modified or annulled.
3. **Audit:** systematic, independent and documented process for obtaining objective evidence and evaluating it to determine the extent to which the audit criteria are met.
4. **Conformity assessment:** demonstration that the specified requirements, in standards or technical regulations, relating to a product, process, system, person or organism are met.
5. **Intrinsic features:** these are internal characteristics of the conformity assessment objects (e.g. chemical, microbiological, physical properties, among other determinants of quality).
6. **Certification:** evaluation related to products, processes, systems or people made by a third party.
7. **Certificate of Conformity:** document issued in accordance with the rules of the conformity assessment subsystem, providing confidence that a duly identified product, process or service complies with the requirements specified in standards or technical regulations.
8. **Placing a Product into Circulation:** Selling, offering for sale or entering into any other commercial or industrial transaction involving a product or industrial equipment for the first time.
9. **Technical Committee for Standardization (CTN) :** permanent committee responsible for drawing up, revising and correcting the NM of a given area of activity.
10. **Technical Committee for Sectorial Standardization (CTNS):** permanent committee responsible for planning, coordinating, assisting and controlling all the work involved in preparing the NM for a given sector of activity.
11. **Buyer:** is every natural or legal person who purchases or uses a product or service.
12. **Consumer:** is every natural or legal person who purchases or uses a product or service as a final recipient.
13. **Supplier's declaration of conformity:** assessment made by the supplier by the first party that a product, process or service meets the requirements specified in a standard or technical regulation.
14. **Designation:** Government authorization of a conformity assessment body to carry out specific conformity assessment activities.
15. **Normative document:** document that defines rules, guidelines or characteristics for activities or their results. In this context, normative documents include, namely, standards, technical specifications, codes of good practice and directives.
16. **Testing:** technical operation that consists of determining one or more characteristics of a given product, process or service according to a specified procedure.
17. **Technical Specification:** document that defines technical requirements that a product or equipment, process, service must comply with.
18. **World-class equipment and infrastructure:** This is excellent, first-rate, high-level, globally renowned equipment and infrastructure, with world-renowned quality.
19. **Labeling:** attestation by a third party, usually through tests, in which a characteristic of the product is determined and informed to the consumer, especially related to its performance.
20. **Supplier:** is every natural or legal person, public or private, national or foreign, as well as non-personalized entities, who carry out activities of production, assembly, creation, construction, transformation, import, export, distribution or commercialization of products or provision of services.
21. **Standardization Working Group (GTN) :** " *ad-hoc* " working group responsible for the study of specific topics and which depends on a CTN or SCTN.
22. **INNOQ, IP:** National Institute for Standardization and Quality-Public Institute.
23. **Inspection:** conformity assessment by observation and accompanied judgment as appropriate by measurements, tests or comparisons.
24. **Physical inspection:** visual verification of the conformity of the product under analysis.
25. **ISO:** International Organization for Standardization.
26. **License:** Document confirming that the product complies with technical standards and regulations. In the context of the implementation of conformity assessment programmes, licenses are issued to manufacturers (and any official representative) for the relevant product categories, in order to confirm their ability to produce products in compliance with the Conformity Assessment Programme as part of a quality management system.
27. **List of mandatory control products:** list containing products considered to pose a risk to public health and safety and the environment, which must be subject to mandatory control;
28. **Conformity Mark :** Protected mark, applied or issued according to the rules of a conformity assessment subsystem, which indicates, with a sufficient level of confidence, that the product, process or service complies with a specific standard or other normative document.
29. **National Conformity Mark:** conformity mark applied based on a technical regulation.
30. **International Standard:** A standard that is adopted by an international standards organization and made available to the public.
31. **Norma Moçambicana/Mozambican Standard (NM) or Norma Técnica Moçambicana/Mozambican Technical standard:** document established by consensus and approved by the National Institute of Standardization and Quality-IP, which provides, for common and repeated use, rules, guidelines or characteristics for activities or their results, guaranteeing a level of optimal organization in a given context.
32. **Regional Standard:** standard adopted by a regional standardization organization and made available to the public.
33. **Standard:** document established by consensus and approved by a recognized body, which provides, for common and repeated use, rules, guidelines or characteristics for activities or their results, guaranteeing an optimal level of organization, in a given context.

34. **Standardisation** : activity aimed at establishing, in the face of real or potential problems, provisions intended for common and repeated use, with a view to obtaining the optimal degree of organization in a given domain.
35. **Harmonized standards**: standards concerning the same subject, adopted by different bodies with standardization functions and which ensure the interchangeability of products, processes and services, or the mutual understanding of test results or information provided in accordance with these standards.
36. **Legitimate purpose**: national security imperatives, the prevention of deceptive practices, the protection of human health or safety, animal or plant health or life or the environment.
37. **Conformity Assessment Body**: laboratory or network of independent laboratories, certification or inspection entity, control authority or other authority that carries out a conformity assessment.
38. **Conformity Assessment Body**: body that performs conformity assessment services.
39. **Stakeholders**: persons or organizations that have an interest in the performance or success of conformity assessment procedures.
40. **Conformity assessment procedure**: any procedure used directly or indirectly to determine that the relevant prescriptions of technical standards or regulations are met.
41. **Process**: set of interrelated and interacting activities that transform inputs into outputs.
42. **Product**: result of a set of interrelated and interacting activities that transform inputs into outputs. There are 4 product categories: service, *software*, *hardware* and processed materials.
43. **Conformity Assessment Programme (CAP)**: it is a conformity assessment procedure, carried out before shipment, used to verify that the products to be imported into the country are in compliance with Mozambican Technical Standards, Regional Technical Standards or international Technical Standards applicable in the country.
44. **Technical Regulation**: document that establishes the characteristics of a given product or process related to it and the production methods, including the applicable administrative clauses, with which compliance is mandatory. This document may also include or exclusively address terminology, symbols, packaging, marking and labeling requirements and how they apply to a product, process or production method.
45. **Technical Requirement**: condition, requirement or technical obligation of a product or a method of production or processing of such a product, including administrative provisions applicable to the product or industrial equipment that is by nature mandatory compliance. The technical requirement may also contain or exclusively refer to terminology, symbols, requirements regarding packaging, designation and indication, if applicable to an industrial product or equipment, production or processing method.
46. **Review**: introduction of all changes deemed necessary to the content and presentation of a normative document.
47. **System**: set of interrelated and interacting elements.
48. **Standardization Technical Subcommittee (SCTN)** : permanent committee responsible for preparing, revising and correcting the NM of specific topics in the area of the CTN on which it depends.
