- 4. The continued function of the Employees Consultative Committee (ECC) which has included gender and workers representation for solving internal disputes and making improvements.

3.3 Issues Raised by Stakeholders and Findings related to each issue

In the course of the surveillance assessment for the MAYVIN GROUPING-PMU, MICM did not receive any new written feedback/comments from stakeholders such as from the NGOs and Local Authorities concerning IOI. Hence no new follow up on any other issues was required during the assessment.

The earlier issues raised by the stakeholders during the previous assessment in 2010 had been responded and appropriate actions had been taken by IOI and satisfactorily implemented and monitored.



Appendix C1: Location Map 1 of MAYVIN GROUPING-PMU



Appendix C2: Location Map 2 of MAYVIN GROUPING-PMU









Map 3-1: Mayvin 1 Estate



Map 3-2: Mayvin 2 Estate



Map 3-3: Mayvin 2&3 Estate



Map 3-4: Mayvin 5 Estate















Re-plantings are scheduled for year 2013 onwards only and the EIA will then be done.

For Morisem Grouping (i.e. Morisem 1 - 5), the EIA work was commenced from February 2010. Now it is under the stage of finalizing report. Total there are 7 steps in EIA approval. We have reached step 6 of preparation of the Environmental Impact Assessment report by environment consultant. We have completed step 1 project screening, step 2 - selection of environmental consultant, step 3 - scoping note approval by EPD, step 4 - Terms of Reference approval by EPD and step 5 undertaking of environment impact assessment study for Morisem Groupings. We already got approval for EIA for Pamol Groupings, Baturong Groupings and Linbar Groupings. Additionally we are doing EIA for Morisem and Ladang Sabah.

Re: Leepang 4 – Riparian reserve at Sungai Sipadom, Sabah

The work initiated only after the issue was brought to IOI's attention in November 2007. IOI had decided to restore the overplanted riparian reserve since then. IOI has removed 497 palms from the riparian reserve of Sungai Sipasidom in March /April 2008. After felling, immediately wild Johnson grass (wild sugarcane) were planted in order to prevent erosions. In Oct 2009, IOI had planted Ficus species of plants, which are indigenous to lower Kinabatangan. Within Leepang 4 estate, there are three species of Ficus and the saplings are planted along the riparian reserve. There are naturally growing Laran and Bongo along riparian reserve and are maintained. Planting of Pannanus is also in progress for any prevention of soil erosion in riparian reserve.

Case 1 - Dispute With The Long Teran Community In Sarawak, Malaysia:

Upon review of reports including discussions and deliberation, the RSPO is pleased to announce that both IOI Corporation Berhad (IOI) and the complainants are now committed to the process of mediation as a means to resolve the dispute. Despite having taken some time due to the complexity of the matter, the RSPO views this as a positive progress in the right direction. The lifting of the current suspension of new certification for IOI will be dependent on the progress attained by both parties concerned as a result of the mediation process.

Case 2 - Dispute In Ketapang District, Kalimantan, Indonesia:

Upon diligent review of the documents submitted to the RSPO, it is concluded that the concerns with regards to drained peat land on wildlife habitat and clearing of HCV of primary forests have not been proven.

However, IOI has accepted that some of the procedural requirements by the RSPO with regards to the permits for new plantings were not adequately complied with. In line with this, IOI has arrived at an agreement with RSPO in committing to improvements in operational procedures, as well as to comply with all RSPO requirements moving forward
